The 2013 ACOG guidelines call for early screening for overt diabetes or gestational diabetes with blood glucose testing only in women identified as having risk factors for gestational diabetes (eg, a history of gestational diabetes, impaired glucose metabolism, or obesity).

In 1965, the WHO Expert Committee on Diabetes Mellitus published the first guideline on diabetes mellitus. They defined gestational diabetes as “hyperglycemia of diabetic levels occurring during pregnancy”. After these initial attempts to define GDM, new follow-up WHO guidelines were published in 1980, 1985, 1999 and 2013.

A glucose tolerance screen glucose threshold >139 mg/dL after a 50-gram load identifies approximately 80% of women with gestational diabetes mellitus, while the sensitivity is further increased to approximately 90% by a threshold >129 mg/dL.
